

# TOUR DETAILS AND ITINERARY

## 1 Day Valley of the Giants and Tree Top Walk

### HIGHLIGHTS:

Travelling through spectacular south-west forests and lush farmland, your day is topped off by a walk through the canopy of towering old-growth forest and visit to the culturally significant Kodja Place.

<b>Duration:</b>	1 Full Day
<b>Departs:</b>	Wednesdays, 7.45am from Barrack Square, (near Bell Tower), Perth foreshore. Also various Perth, Fremantle and Scarborough hotels on request.
<b>Arrives:</b>	Arrive back at 10.30pm (approx.)
<b>Passengers:</b>	6 - 48 people
<b>Luggage:</b>	None required. Personal water bottle handy to bring if possible.
<b>Fitness:</b>	All levels okay. Special assistance can also be requested.
<b>Dietary requests:</b>	Picnic lunch provided. Special dietary requirements met if requested.
<b>What to bring:</b>	Hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, water bottle, camera. Wet weather gear if inclement weather forecast.

### ITINERARY:

Travel south through Donnybrook, famous for its apple and stone fruit orchards. Enjoy scenic touring through rolling farmlands of the Blackwood River Valley.

Travel through Western Australia's old growth forest to see the 51m tall Diamond Tree bush fire watch tower. Climb it if you dare, or simply enjoy a picnic lunch in a tranquil bush setting.

We then visit the Valley of the Giants 'Tree Top Walk,' a 600 metre long elevated walkway through the forest canopy reaching up to 40 metres above ground.

On the ground walk through the Ancient Empire of wide girthed Tingle Trees up to 10 metres in diameter.

Visit Denmark before returning to Perth at approximately 10.30pm.

Stop en-route for dinner (own expense) at Kodja Place Visitor Centre.

### Donnybrook

Known as the 'Apple Capital' of the South West, travel through this unique town. If time permits be sure to buy yourself some delicious local produce.

# TOUR DETAILS AND ITINERARY

## **Diamond Tree**

This 51 metre tall Karri tree has been operating as a fire lookout for over 70 years, following its construction in 1940. If you are up for an adventure then you can try and climb this tree, making your way up along the metal spikes in the side of the tree. The breathtaking views from the top of the lookout are worth the climb.

## **Valley of the Giants**

Get up close and personal with these 400 year old giants of the south west tingle forest region. Walk through the treetop canopy, along the gradually elevated walkway, suitable for all ages. The highest point of the 600 metre loop is about 40 metres.

## **Ancient Empire**

Featuring a grove of tingle trees the Ancient Empire is a picturesque walk, be in awe at the sheer size of these giants, with some of the trees circumferences spanning up to 16 metres.

## **William Bay**

View the stunning coastal scenery and windswept rocky shores, famous at William Bay.

## **Kodja Place**

Rich in cultural history the Kodja Place Visitor Centre features an informative display of insight in to traditional Noongar history of the area and life of the tight knit community.

## **Wildflowers (seasonal)**

Stop to view wildflowers throughout the tour whilst they are in season. Varieties include the orange flowering Christmas Tree, Kangaroo Paw, Banksia, Wattle and Everlastings.

## **Notes:**

Strong wind conditions may result in the closure of the Tree Top Walk – alternative touring arrangements will be made. Profusion of wildflowers depends on weather and other conditions, therefore we can't guarantee sightings. Wear comfortable walking shoes, bring a hat and camera.
